BIOGRAPHICAL AND SUBJECT SUMMARY:

Charles H. Dayhuff, Jr., born in Walla Walla, Washington in 1906, graduated from V.M.I. in 1931 after a distinguished academic and military career. He then attended George Washington University receiving his MA in 1953. From 1931 to 1936, Dayhuff taught English and Economics at V.M.I. For the next three years he taught at Culver Military Academy in Indiana before joining the Army in 1939. Dayhuff's military career was illustrious and varied. During World War II he served as armor officer and was awarded the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star and the Army Commendation Medal. After this he served as advisor on Latin American Affairs in the War Department, taught at the Army War College and was assistant director of the joint intelligence group for the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Upon retiring from the Army in 1961, with rank of Colonel, Dayhuff returned to teaching this time at Valley Forge Military Academy from which he has since retired.

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION AND ARRANGEMENT:

The collection consists of courses offered at the Army War College in the 1950's on Turkey and the Middle East. There is one small folder of Dayhuff's notes as well as two speeches he gave. Also included are mimeograph copies of correspondence between C. H. Dayhuff III and his parents written while he was an advisor in Vietnam in 1964-1965.
