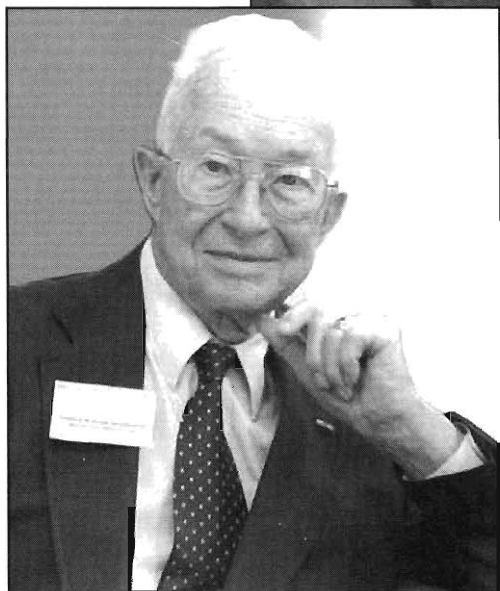
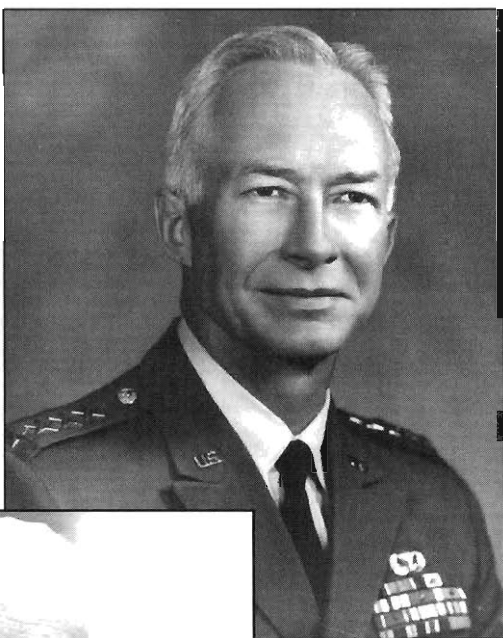
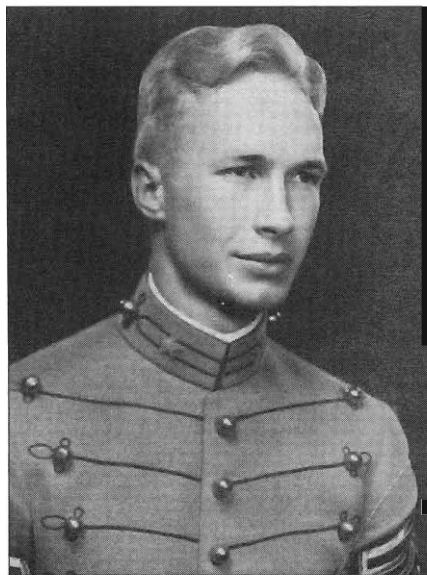

# BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

General Andrew J. Goodpaster was born on February 12, 1915, in Granite City, Illinois. He was a student at McKendree College starting in 1931, before accepting a commission to the United States Military Academy in 1935. He graduated from West Point, second in his class, in 1939, and was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Corps of Engineers. His first assignment was with the 11th Combat Engineer Regiment in Panama, 1939–1942.

He commanded the 48th Engineer Combat Battalion in North Africa and Italy during World War II. From 1944 to 1947, he served in the War Department and the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Between 1947 and 1950, he attended Princeton University, receiving a Master of Science degree in engineering and an MA and Ph.D. in International Relations. For the last six months of 1950, he was a member of the Joint Advanced Study Committee of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Starting in 1951, General Goodpaster resumed his military service. He was: Special Assistant to the Chief of Staff, Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe; Defense Liaison Officer and Staff Secretary to President Dwight D. Eisenhower; Assistant Commander of the 3rd Infantry Division and Commander of the 8th Infantry Division; Assistant to the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff; Director, Joint Staff, Organization of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; Commandant of the National War College; Deputy Commander of U.S. Forces in Vietnam; and finally, from 1969 to 1974, Commander-in-Chief, United States European Command and Supreme Allied Commander, Europe.

He retired in 1974 and became a senior Fellow at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars. In 1976, he was selected as the first incumbent of the John C. West Chair of Government and International Studies at The Citadel.

In 1977, General Goodpaster was recalled to active duty as the 51st Superintendent of the United States Military Academy, serving until 1981. Since his second retirement from active duty, General Goodpaster has been affiliated with numerous organizations, including serving as Chairman of the Eisenhower World Affairs Institute, Institute for Defense Analyses, The Atlantic Council of the United States, and the George C. Marshall Foundation.

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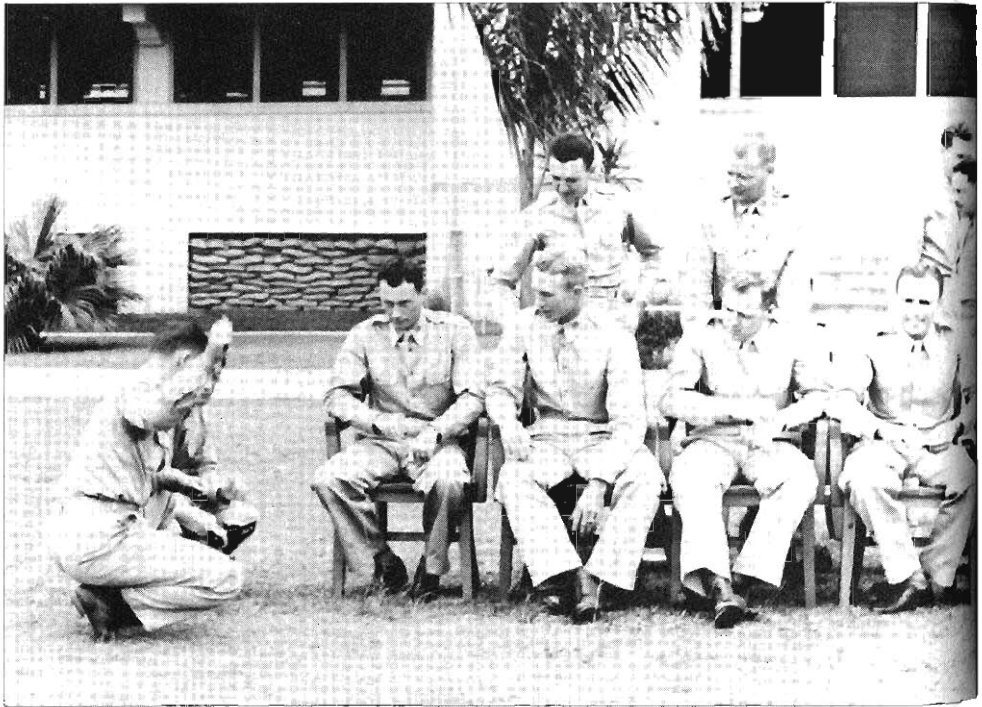

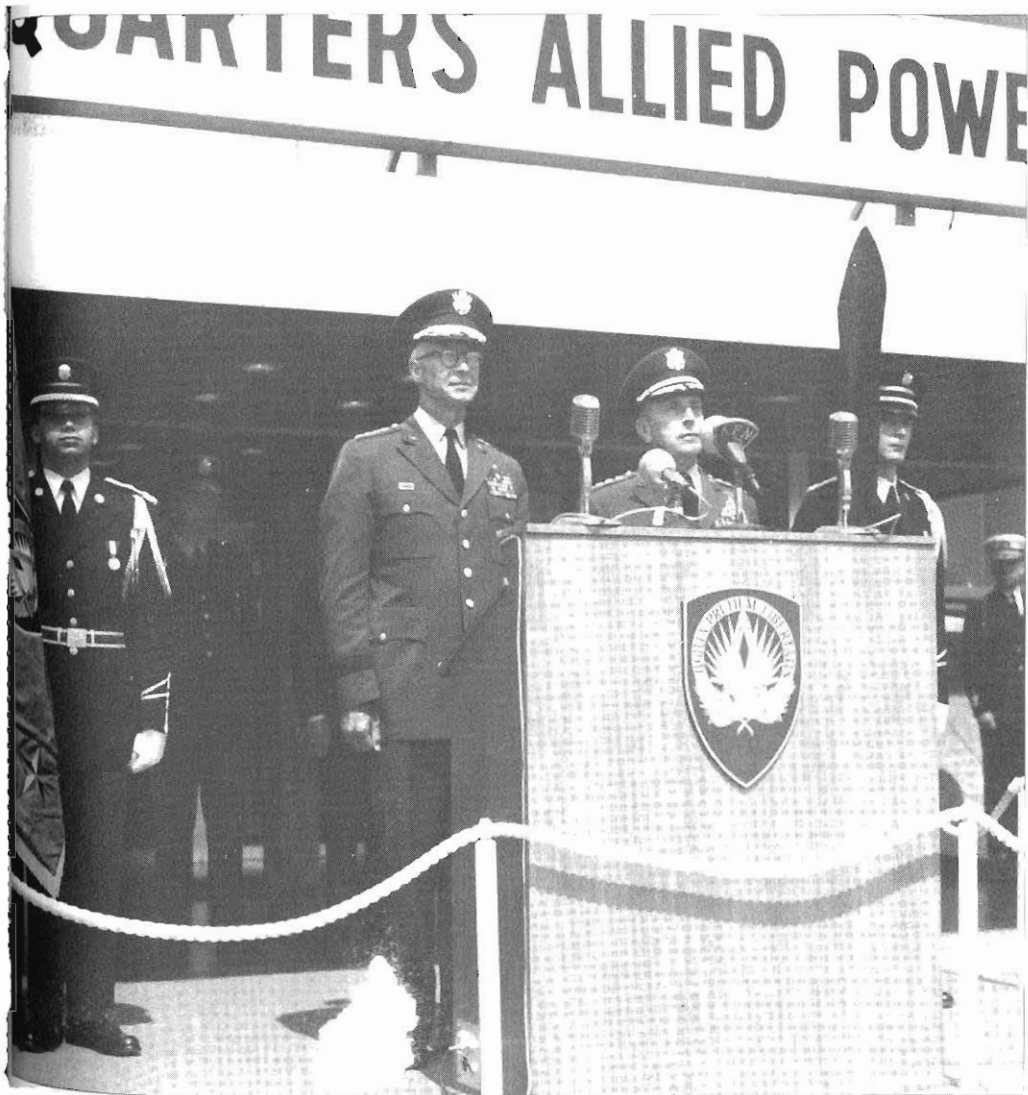
