BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL FEATURES: Anne Scarborough Philbin was a journalist for the *Baltimore News-Post* during the Second World War. In addition to covering domestic news stories from war-time Baltimore, she also reported on the Women's Army Corps and military campaigns in the European Theater of Operations, particularly in the Saar Campaign of 1944.

SUBJECTS: The collection contains numerous articles written by Philbin, and photographs of World War II events, as well as personal effects and journalistic materials from the Cold War. The collection also includes a number of letters recounting the service of General Tobias R. Philbin in the 95th Division.

FORMS OF MATERIAL: The Collection is comprised of one large flat box containing a scrapbook of photographs and newspaper clippings, loose scrapbook pages, newspaper clippings, and photocopies of newspaper clippings; plus a magazine, *Berliner Illustrirte*. In a smaller box are photographs, letters, and booklets.
