BIOGRAPHICAL AND SUBJECT SUMMARY:

Marie Marshall Singer, only sister of George C. Marshall, was born near Washington, Pennsylvania, in December 1876. She was the third child and only daughter of George Catlett Marshall and his wife, Laura Emily Bradford. She was christened Marie Louise, for her maternal grandmother, Marie Louise Stuart Bradford.

In November 1902, Marie married John J. Singer of Connellsville, Pennsylvania, and moved with him toGreensburg, Pa. She made Greensburg her home until her death on June 11, 1962. The Singers had no children.

The Singer Collection contains information on George C. Marshall and the Marshall family in general.

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION AND ARRANGEMENT:

The collection consists of clippings, reports, itineraries, souvenir menus, correspondence, promissory notes, post cards, tax receipts, lease and rent receipts, a draft of a telegram, photographs, daguerrotypes, and genealogy of the Marshall family. These materials are arranged by type into one box.

## MARIE MARSHALL SINGER COLLECTION Introduction

The Marie Marshall Singer Collection became the property of the Marshall Foundation in 1967. It is an important collection of papers, for it contains material dealing with the childhood of the Marshall children, their ancestors and family, and their daily lives.

The collection consists of clippings, reports, itineraries, souvenir menus, memorabilia, correspondence, post cards, tax receipts, lease and rent receipts, telegram, photographs, dauerrotypes, and a genealogy of the Marshall family. The genealogy has been placed in the map case; the memorabilia are in the museum, and the photographs are located in the photograph room.

The Singer Collection is a gift of the Marie Marshall Singer Estate, and there are no restrictions on its use.

#### Biographical Sketch

Marie Marshall Singer, only sister of George C. Marshall, was born near Washington, Pennsylvania, December 16, 1876. She was the third child and only daughter of George Catlett Marshall and his wife, Laura Emily Bradford. She was christened Marie Louise for her maternal grandmother, Marie Louise Stuart Bradford. Marie was intelligent and capable, and was well-educated in private schools.

In November 1902, Marie married Princeton graduate John Johnston Singer, a doctor from Connellsville, Pennsylvania, and son of Mrs. Jennie J. Singer. The couple made their home in Greenburg, Pa. They had no children, and after John Singer's death in 1934, she remained in Greenburg. She died there on June 11, 1962.

#### Scope and Content Note

The Marie Marshall Singer Collection consists of letters, newspaper clippings, business correspondence, post cards, tax and rent receipts, souvenirs, museum items, and photographs.

The items span the time period from 1834 to 1958. George C.

Marshall wrote several of the letters to his mother and to his sister, Marie Singer. There is a military report written by

Marshall; business correspondence of George Marshall, Sr., and

Laura Bradford Marshall; itineraries; clippings concerning Marie's marriage to John J. Singer, M.D., and dealing with Marshall and his wife Katherine; a letter written by Katherine Tupper Marshall describing the Marshall's 1948 trip to Greece and the Mediterranean; John J. Singer's diary; menus from banquets honoring General Pershing; and dance cards and ticket to V.M.I.'s Final Ball in 1900.

The papers are located in one document box. They have been arranged according to the type of material, and chronologically within that type.
