BIOGRAPHICAL AND SUBJECT SUMMARY:

The collection is made up primarily of book reviews, magazine articles, clippings, and one letter, all dealing with Therese Bonney's book Europe's Children. The book itself is located in the library, and shows the horrors of World War II through pictures of children. The letter is an original from Miss Bonney to Henry Stimson, Secretary of War, dated April 11, 1944, and is about her book, the War Department, and fighting isolationism.

Mabel Therese Bonney, journalist, photographer, and author of Europe's Children, was born in Syracuse, New York, a daughter of Anthony Le Roy and Addie Robie Bonney. She graduated from the University of California, received an M.A. at Harvard, attended Columbia University and the Sorbonne in Paris. She has spent much of her life abroad, and knew such notables as Anne Morgan, George Bernard Shaw, Lord and Lady Astor, and Gertrude Stein. She toured all over Europe, promoting the organization of Junior Red Cross groups, and received the Croix de Guerre, with star, for her efforts.
