BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL FEATURES: Roger Jeans was a professor of East Asian history at Washington and Lee University.

SUBJECT: Research material for the article "Victims or Victimizers? Museums, Textbooks, and the War debate in Contemporary Japan," *The Journal of Military History* 69 (January 2005): 149-196. This essay addresses a widespread misperception in mainstream thinking about Japanese views of their World War II record. This article, through an analysis of the exhibits and descriptive literature of Japanese "war" and "peace" museums as well as recent struggles over how to depict Japan's wartime record in school textbooks, disagrees. Rather than a unified "Japanese" view of the war, the reality is a struggle in which conservatives and right-wingers duel with moderates and leftists over the "correct history" of the war.

FORMS OF MATERIAL: The collection consists mainly of newspaper articles, research notes, book reviews, and email correspondence. There are also guidebook materials from Japan concerning temples and museums.

ARRANGEMENT: The collection contains three boxes with originally titled folders that are arranged in alphabetical order. All materials remain in the intellectual order imposed by the author.
