**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL FEATURES:** Robert B. Morrison was a member of the Washington and Lee University Section of the United States Ambulance Corps. He and his family had lived in Lexington, Virginia before he moved to a training camp in Allentown, Pennsylvania in 1917. In late spring of 1918, his unit was sent to “somewhere in France.”

**SUBJECT:** The United States Ambulance Corps during World War I.

**FORMS OF MATERIAL:** The collection consists mainly of letters, postcards, and newspaper clippings. There are two documents from the 1960s that consist of photos, remembrances, and itineraries, which focus on W & L Ambulance Corps reunions.
