1. Buffalo Newspaper Clippings.
Four photocopies of articles from a Buffalo newspaper.
The articles were researched by Mr. Ron Arnold, USMC
Korean War.
2. Furguson, Pat. "Never Quite Forgotten".
Photocopy of magazine article. Donor says, "This will
give you a better understanding of why they designed the
memorial as they did."
3. Map of Bunker Hill.
1 photocopy. Map is small and imposed on background
picture of Bunker Hill. According to donor, "Bunker was
122 meters high--about 3 to 5 acres. We fought for it
from August until almost October. Some days it changed
hands at sun up and sun down. If you got wounded you had
to stay till darkness."

5. Surrender Leaflets.
2 color photocopies and 1 black and white copy of
surrender leaflets. These were leaflets sent to North
Korean soldiers during the Korean War.
6. Videotape concerning Korean War. Buffalo, NY.
Mr. Ron Arnold (39 Admiral Blvd., Buffalo, NY 14216) is
the narrator of the tape. He is wearing a tan rain coat.
He was a rifle man in Korea and was wounded on Bunker
Hill on August 16, 1952. Thomas F. Higgins (10 Delaware
Ave., Buffalo, NY 14202-3999), sheriff of Erie County,
Buffalo, NY, is also on the tape. He was a forward
observer for artillery, 11th Marines, 1st Mar. Div.
