BIOGRAPHICAL AND SUBJECT SUMMARY:

Joe Noake of Texas served in both World War I and World War II. During WW I he served in the First Army, and was stationed in France. He worked under General Robert McCleave with Marshall during the operations at St. Mihiel, and Marshall stayed with them until the Meuse-Argonne plans were completed.

The collection contains a letter, a clipping, a memo, ~~two envelopes~~, and 3 photographs. The letter is from General Robert McCleave to Noake, dated May 23, 1942, and is handwritten. In the letter are a few reminiscences of WW I, comments on Marshall, and kind regards to Noake, who is about to go back into the service. The newspaper clipping is about McCleave, Chief of Staff of the 3rd Division. The memo is to McCleave from the Adjutant General, dated August 14, 1919, concerning McCleave's being awarded the Distinguished Service Medal. The photographs are of Ligy-en-Barrois, France, where Noake and McCleave were stationed.
