**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL FEATURES:** Albert Love lived in Atlanta and was a partner in the publishing firm, Tupper and Love, with Katherine T. Marshall's brother, General Tristram Tupper. Tupper and Love had only been in the publishing business for one year when they published Mrs. Marshall's book, *Together*. It was the first lucrative project for the young publishing firm.

**SUBJECT:** The publication of Katherine T. Marshall's book *Together* with some personal anecdotes about George C. Marshall.

**FORMS OF MATERIAL:** The collection consists of personal letters written to Mr. and Mrs. Albert Love from Mrs. Marshall along with one letter written by George C.
