BIOGRAPHICAL SUMMARY: Captain Arthur Palfrey Terry was Commander of Company B, 320th Infantry, 80th Division, which saw service in France during World War I. He arrived in France on May 30, 1918, and served there until late in 1919, taking part in the Battle of Meuse-Argonne and in the Commission to Negotiate Peace. The collection primarily consists of materials concerning his World War I career.

SUBJECT: World War I

FORMS OF MATERIAL: correspondence, certificates, documents, maps, newspaper clippings, photographs, programs

ARRANGEMENT: The Arthur P. Terry Collection, Additions begins with correspondence (5 letters) that Terry sent to his parents while serving overseas during World War I. Two additional pieces of correspondence are written by others, but relate to issues concerning Terry. Following the correspondence are Terry's American Expeditionary Forces identity card and his officer's record book. After these documents is a single folder containing two photographs. The next three folders contain Terry's honorable discharge certificate and two additional certificates. Newspaper clippings about Arthur P. Terry's death are found in the next folder. The final folder in the box contains a program and newspaper clippings for the 35th reunion of the 80th Division Veterans Association.

A large photograph of Arthur P. Terry, his certificate of appointment in the Officers' Reserve Corps of the United States Army, and a map depicting the major tactics of battles from July 18 to November 11, 1918, are housed in an oversized folder.
