Teachers may attend one of two sessions: Session 1 (June 17 to 20) or Session 2 (July 8 to 11). By design, each session is small, limited to 14 teachers, to promote collaboration among teachers, historians, archivists, and seminar staff.

The George C. Marshall Foundation provides lodging, meals, and a travel allowance for all educators. Teachers who complete the 4-day seminar also receive a \$400 honorarium and professional development certificate.
